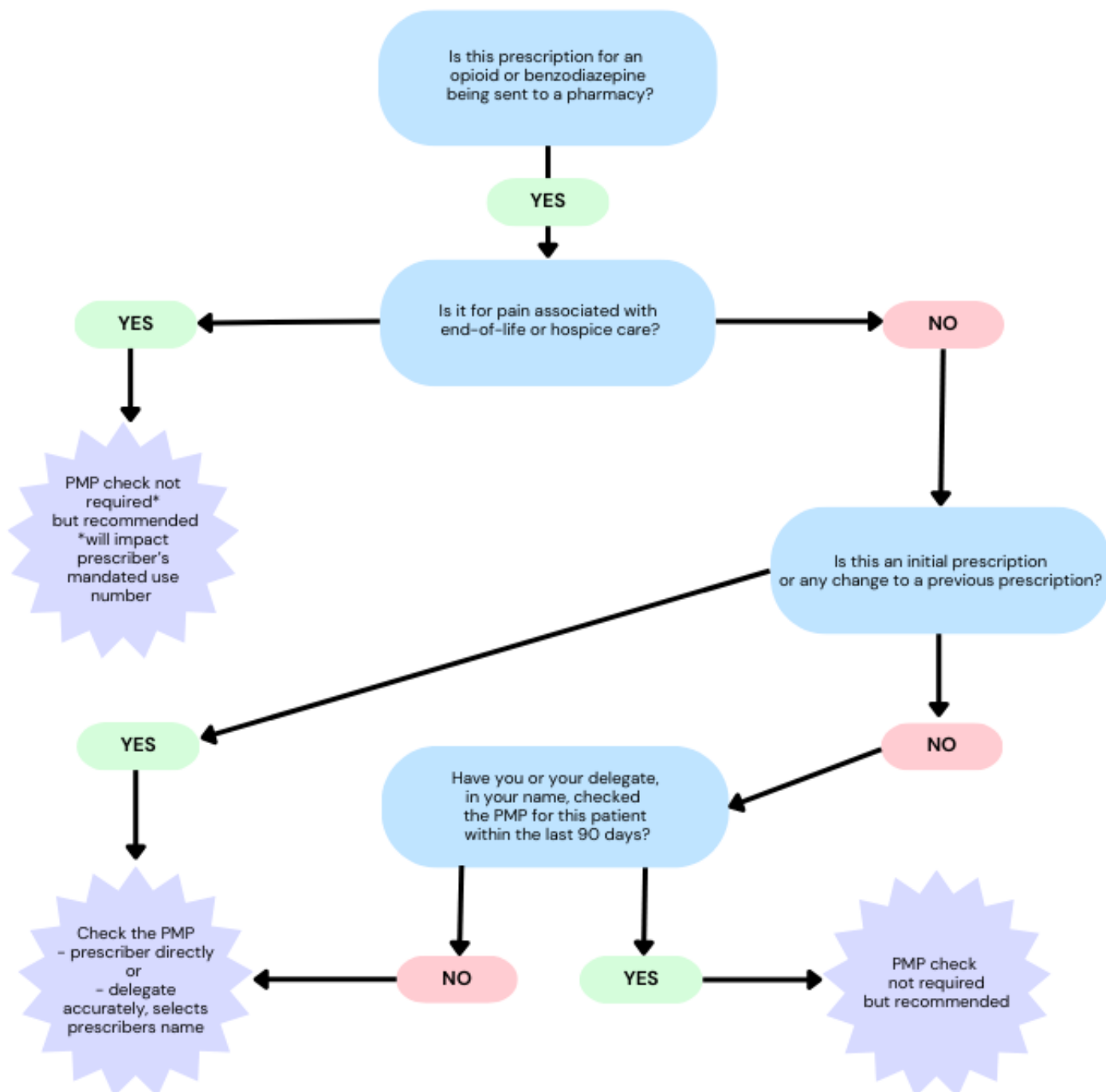


# PMP Check Workflow



## What gives a prescriber "credit" for checking the PMP?

- Prescriber checks in the PMP
- Prescriber checks through HealthInfoNet
- Prescriber uses integrated PMP "Gateway" in EHR's electronic prescribing of controlled substances (EPCS) platform to check as prescription is written
- Prescriber personally reviews (on paper or a screen) a PMP report that delegate pulled **\*in that prescriber's name\*** (if in doubt, double check under "RxSearch/Requests History"). Recommended to reference this type of review in the office/refill note.

## What does not give a prescriber "credit" for checking the PMP?

- Not checking
- Checking after the prescription is sent
- Delegate pulls report under a different prescriber's name
- Another prescriber checks (even if they are a group partner)
- Prescriber/delegate checked more than 90 days ago (for chronic, recurring scripts)

## What does not register in the PMP compliance score but is still compliant with the checking law?

- Prescriber/delegate spells the patient's name incorrectly or differently than the PMP record (even though the incorrect spelling generated a report)
- Prescriber/delegate used the partial name search function to generate a report
- Prescriber uses the end-of-life/hospice pain exemption (this is legally allowed, however, the PMP compliance score does not know that the exemption was used)
